Two Preschoolers To Be Baptized This Month

“Pastor Elizabeth, what does it mean to be *bathized*?”

In my first year at Second Presbyterian, I got this very sincere question from one of our preschoolers. We had just hosted our first Preschool Sunday, during which we baptized a precious baby girl. This sweet preschooler was curious about what he had seen and what it all might mean. So, I shared with him about Jesus’ baptism in the New Testament. I told him about how God said, “This is my child, whom I love. The joy of my life.”

Baptisms are special, and they can come in different shapes and sizes:

- When someone believes in God, baptism is a way of showing others that you are a part of God’s family.
- Sometimes, people get baptized when they are babies. Sometimes, people get baptized when they are grown-ups.
- Sometimes, they get baptized in church Sanctuaries with a small bowl of water or at a tall baptismal font. Sometimes, they get baptized in pools in the church, or out in rivers or lakes. All those ways count as baptism – and we do it today because Jesus was baptized and told us to baptize others, too.

Each time I meet children at the font in our Sanctuary, I am in awe of how God can take something ordinary like water and use it to let us know that we are a part of God’s family. In the same way, I am in awe that God can take an ordinary baby or teenager or grown-up, knowing all of the imperfect things about that person, and say, “This is my child, whom I love. The joy of my life.”

The next time you turn on the water from your tap, take a moment – even if it is just a second – and remember God claims you, God loves you. Maybe touch a little dot of water to your forehead. In our country, water is something so ordinary that we take it for granted – we bathe in it, we brush our teeth in it, we clean our dishes with it – but God uses it to call us family.

Later this month, I will get to share in the joy of baptism as I officiate the baptisms of Macy and Andrew Moore. I know God’s heart will be singing, “This is my daughter, Macy, whom I love. This is my son, Andrew, whom I love.
