Dear Second Presbyterian Preschool Parents,

The temporary shutdown of the preschool presents a significant challenge to most every one of you. I also realize the need to keep your preschooler's mind and body engaged in learning. Closing the school temporarily due to a COVID-19 case is the realization of my worst fear over the last 11 months.

Fortunately, my COVID-19 symptoms have been mild and very manageable. I suspect that the first dose of the vaccine I got on January 22<sup>nd</sup> has helped with that. While the preschool staff has followed strict protocols laid out and updated by the COVID-19 Task Force, when I tested positive, we were unable to isolate the exposure to only a few classrooms. The reason for this is during the 48 hours prior to the onset of my symptoms on Thursday of last week, I was in 6 of the 8 preschool classrooms and in close proximity to a teacher(s) or a small group of students for 15 minutes or longer.

The preschool has been short-staffed since the beginning of the school year. We have struggled to find teachers and substitute teachers as our enrollment has grown. Therefore, I have had to be in classrooms to fill in the gaps - subbing for teachers, teacher assistants, and aftercare workers. Last Tuesday and Wednesday, I was subbing in several classrooms as well as participating in a few learning activities with small groups of students. To reassure you, I was always wearing a mask covering my nose and mouth and I was washing my hands in between classrooms and throughout the day.

Once we re-open, I will no longer be in classrooms with teachers or students. I will communicate with them from the hallway or outdoors on the playground only. If we are unable to find subs when needed, we will unfortunately have to cancel school or aftercare for that classroom.

## Good News

- This month, June Brunk will be joining our team as an aftercare teacher in the infant room 5 afternoons each week.
- Bobbie Black, our recently retired Preschool Assistant Director, is coming back this month to substitute teach.

- Staff vaccinations will be completed by mid-month so the teachers will be protected, and, in turn, your children will be even less likely to contract the virus from their teachers or give it to them.



Parents, if there is **any way you can carve a few hours out of your morning schedule**, please consider volunteering to sub! You will have a great time and be showered in smiles and laughter.

## Summer Program

In years past, the preschool typically offered 3 one-week camps (science, art, and music) for rising threes, rising fours and kindergarten children. Last summer, the Preschool Task Force proposed to the Church a pilot, Year-Round program for one class of each of the following age groups: Infants, Ones, and Young Twos. This pilot program would run for 11 weeks during June, July, and August and would offer before and aftercare. The Church enthusiastically approved the proposal.

Currently enrolled students in our Infants, Ones, and Young Twos classes will receive, via email, a Summer Program Registration Form in the next week or so. Parents should select the weeks they would like to enroll their child and return the completed form and a check made payable to Second Presbyterian Preschool for the non-refundable \$150 deposit that will be applied to your child's first week. Space is limited and community interest is high, so please do not delay in returning your child's form and payment.

During the last 7 months, parents of Twos+(Bees), Threes (Bears), and, Fours (Owls) have expressed significant interest in having their preschoolers in a summer program for more weeks and hours than our typical camps have provided. I appreciate the interest, and I am exploring that possibility of expanding the summer pilot program to include our older students for this summer. I cannot yet say whether plans will be approved to move forward, but I hope to be in touch with an update later this month. Thanks for your patience!
